

SKILLS DEVELOPED THROUGH PARTICIPATION IN AN ACT CLASS

CREATIVITY

Students learn how to think creatively **through role-playing**.

CONCENTRATION

Having to listen and contribute during classes or rehearsals helps to develop concentration and focus skills.

ENSEMBLIZING

Students learn the importance of working together as an ensemble or team of kind mindful students.

SELF CONFIDENCE IMPROVEMENT

Students gain self-confidence as they succeed in the hands- on-learning of theatre arts skills.

SPATIAL AWARENESS

Students are taught how to move onstage as well as how to create a specific movement for their characters.

DETERMINATION

With consistent practice and determination, students get a feeling of accomplishment after a performance. Developing determination at a young age helps them reach their goals in the future.

RECEIVING CONSTRUCTIVE CRITICISM

Through the theater, students learn that feedback is just another part of the learning process, not something that should be taken personally. We always ask 'What went well with the scene or improvisation' and 'What could have been better'.

PROBLEM SOLVING

Students learn problem-solving skills in the theatre arts.

LISTENING AND COMMUNICATION SKILLS

Acting involves listening as well as speaking. Students learn how to listen to one another on and off stage, increasing their communication skills
